Pregnancy loss, mental health and the NHS

The Miscarriage Association conducted some research to help us review and develop the support we offer around pregnancy loss and mental health Preliminary research published in 2016¹ showed that women who have miscarried are at higher risk of post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) And women with pre-existing mental health problems may be particularly vulnerable after pregnancy loss, as well

§ Social withdrawal might be a coping mechanism (Jansen & Sainte Onge 2015) § It's a 'lonely' journey (Reid and Alfred 2013, Allan 2007) Lived Experience § Women report treatment is one of the most stressful experiences (Cousineau and Domar 2007) § It's also invasive, costly and uses hormone based medication § Those undergoing treatment report high levels depression and anxiety

therapy Coping is a conscious effort to reduce stress²⁵ Accordingly, the capacity to adapt to infertility-related stress depends on psychological coping mechanisms or coping strategies^{26 27} As pointed out earlier, infertility is a low-control stressor, particularly during the waiting period Terry and Hynes²⁸ have examined women's
