Captain James Cook James Cook grew up in a great age of sail Although Europeans had sailed all the way around the world in the 1500s, much of what lay in the Southern Hemisphere remained a mystery British seaman and commander James Cook changed all that He was born in a Yorkshire village on 27 October 1728, and worked for a coal-shipping company at Whitby, on the Yorkshire coast James Cook
