Trade in the Ancient Near East: Lagaš, Ur, Larsa, Mari

It is commonly referred to as the Ancient Near East (ANE) (Kuhrt, 1995, p. 1; Snell, 1997, p. ix). Farming developed in the northern foothills of the Fertile Crescent by 9,000 BCE. By 5500 BCE people had migrated south and established settlements in Southern Mesopotamia. By the fourth millennium two cultures flourished near the Persian Gulf: Sumer on the Gulf and Akkad to the north (Snell, 1997).
