While the Anglo-Saxons ate and drank they would listen to people telling stories Their favourite stories involved brave warriors and their adventures, for example the story of Beowulf, a heroic prince who killed many monsters The story-teller would be accompanied by people playing music Common instruments that the Anglo-Saxons played were the lyre and the horn flute Circle-dancing was

Anglo-Saxon Religious Beliefs - High View School

Anglo-Saxons were pagans much like the Vikings of Scandinavia Anglo-Saxon pagans were superstitious believing in spells and lucky charms They thought that 'magic' rhymes, potions, stones or jewels would protect them from evil spirits or sickness The Saxons also worshiped several gods like Woden, the divine father and King of the Anglo-Saxon gods (A German version of the Scandinavian)
