The Bayeux tapestry is likely to bave been designed in a Canterbury monastery, and Francis Wormald bas argued convincingly for St Augustine's on the basis of parallels in contemporary manuscript illuminationss The tapestry's sopbisticated intertextual references mean that it cannot be read as a simple reflection of eleventh-century political events or even as a reliable source of information
