To what extent was the Protestant Reformation responsible ...

the Reformation was not entirely theologically motivated Many amongst the political elite of Europe saw the adoption of the Protestant Religion as a way of bypassing the high Papal taxation, and seizing the vast clerical wealth within their kingdoms Religious fervour provoked a century of violent conflict, with the Thirty Years War
