The first showed that children and adolescents who received a psychological intervention had reduced HbA1c levels (SMD = -0.35, 95% CI -0.66 to -0.04) and psychological distress (SMD = -0.5, 95% CI: -0.8 to -0.1) compared to controls [15] The second meta-analysis focused on family-based psycho-educational interventions and found a beneficial effect on both glycaemic control (mean difference
