The Wars of the Roses: A Timeline of Key Events Edward III

22 May 1455: The first significant conflict in the Wars of the Roses takes place at St Albans This is a Yorkist victory and the King is captured and escorted back to London The Duke of York is re-appointed Lord Protector due to the King having suffered a further mental breakdown and a period of relative peace is established York is dismissed again in 1456 when Henry VI has a lucid period
