Victorian children did not have as many toys and clothes as children do today and many of them were homemade What work did Victorian children do? So, what sort of jobs did children do? Lucky children got apprenticed into a trade It was the trade master's job to teach the child how to do their job Apprentices normally worked a 12-hour day and were not allowed to work on Sundays After working a long day, children did not normally have enough time to go to school Children were often forced to work in factories, sweep chimneys, become

As a result, Victorians tended to take refuge in the idea that religion was the only way to explain the world of nature, expressing a belief that nowadays would be called intelligent design A series of treatises published in the 1830s argued "that design and benevolence were everywhere visible in the natural world", a belief put to practical effect by the man who commissioned them, the
